to sit on a bench under trees and look at the park activities like baseball games. The Zipper would pull things together by placing trees on both sides of Governor as well as the median. A zipper has interlocking teeth, and the trees would be placed to strategically resemble this on both sides of the road.

While both ideas were met with interest, approval, and some concern about taking away available parking. The Splash Gardens garnered the most votes, an almost unanimous choice. Widening medians to nine feet between Stadium and Mercer, the medians will serve as colorful garden spots of California natives, giving energy as well as beauty. The color will spill onto Governor with colored concrete that will encourage drivers to slow down and look around. "Landscape sculpture" was a term used to describe this design.

What is the next step? The landscape architects will refine their designs. Mitchell Berner of Public Solutions will seek out grant money to pay for this project. The community will continue to be invited to give input in this beautification project.

...The University City North South Transportation Corridor Public Working Committee has been established and will have a website, www.ucnorthsouth.com, on line within the next few weeks...

...The University Community Plan is almost 95 percent built out. Several approved major projects have either begun or will soon start construction. Check Future Development at our website, www.universitycityca.com.. ...Representatives from Communities and Equity Office. appeared before the UCPG on March 11th, and will be on the agenda at future meetings. In response to questions about the height of the 40 story building and the three 30 story buildings he is proposing to build at Costa Verde, Stuart Posnack of Garden Communities displayed renderings showing the placement of the towers in relation to existing buildings within and across the street from the project area. Projected height of the 30 story buildings is 325 ft., 320 ft and 325 ft.; the 40 story is 455 ft. He stated the Wells Fargo Building, often used as a comparison, is 259 ft. There are no height limitations in the community plan, but Miramar does review projects... Representatives of Equity Office Partners stated their plans to build at the NW corner of La Jolla Village Dr. and the planned Judicial Dr. call for a 500% increase in the density allotted them in the Community Plan. They are seeking a community plan amendment and have submitted a draft EIR. The project is in the 2nd review cycle.


