

UC's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Grows

After the devastating Cedar Fire that took 15 lives, destroyed more than 280,000 acres and 2,400 homes and caused \$819 million in damages in October of 2003, the City of San Diego's Fire-Rescue Department developed the CERT San Diego program to help meet the needs of local communities following disasters. Scripps Ranch and Tierrasanta were the first communities to form CERT teams. Now, there is at least one CERT team in every council district. The goal is to have a 50 member CERT team in every community.

CERT Program Manager Barbara Ayers spoke at the April 2005 UCCA meeting. Last November, Ayers and representatives of the San Diego Fire Rescue Dept. spoke at a forum at UC High sponsored by Councilman Scott Peters and again pointed out the need for individuals, families and communities to prepare and be able to be self-sustaining for at least 3 days following a disaster. With Hurricane Katrina and the Cedar fire still fresh in mind, volunteers from all over the city began signing up for CERT training.

Who volunteers for CERT? Adults of all ages from all walks of life. On Saturday, March 18th, Karen Bassler, Mary Ann Guerra, Julie Kerr, Carole Pietras and Mary Weinbrecht were among 142 graduates, the largest class in CERT history. They joined previous graduates Greg Hom and Susan Hathaway on UC's team that is

combined with La Jolla, UTC and Carmel Valley.

Prior to graduation on Saturday, the students in the CERT academy participated in a Disaster Drill which simulated the aftermath of a 7.5 earthquake. Local residents, Pat Drobeck, Joel Rosenberg and Nicholas Guerra were among those who volunteered to serve as victims.

If you would like to join our team, a Fast Track CERT academy will be held at the Community Room at UTC in April. To be accepted for the Fast Track academy, volunteers must first complete the online FEMA class. Visit www.CertSanDiego.org, email cert@sandiego.gov or call (619) 533-3075 for more information.






