

Emergency Preparedness, Ability to Sustain Ourselves for a Minimum of 72 Hours Stressed at Public Safety Forum

Over seventy-five community members attended the Emergency Preparedness and Public Safety Forum sponsored by Councilman Scott Peters at UC High on November 17th. Betsy Kinsley, Councilman Peters Chief of Staff, introduced Speakers Augie Ghio, Director of the City of San Diego Homeland Security. Deputy Chief John Thompson of the Fire Rescue Department, Sgt. Phil Terhaar of the San Diego Police Department and Barbara Ayers, Program Manager of the (Community Emergency Response Team) Program. Deputy Mayor Toni Atkins. attending in place Councilman Scott Peters, presented opening remarks and commented during the evening.

While the speakers addressed various aspects of disaster preparedness, each stressed we must be prepared to sustain ourselves for a *minimum* of 72 hours in the event of an emergency or disaster. Augie Ghio spoke of the regional coordination taking place to respond to disasters but also emphasized the need for individuals, neighborhoods and communities to develop disaster plans. Do you know which of your neighbors would need assistance in the event of a disaster or need to evacuate?

Deputy Chief John Thompson, who went to New Orleans to assist in search and rescue operations after the

hurricane, reiterated, "You are the solution to the problem. You must be able to take care of yourself for 72 hours minimum." He emphasized the need for brush clearance around homes and the danger of shake shingle roofs. Chief Thompson said weather put the Cedar fire out; otherwise it would have burned down the 52 corridor right through our community and to La Jolla and the ocean. He said that agencies in Southern California, the City and County are working together, but we must be prepared.

Sgt. Phil Terhaar of the San Diego Police Dept. spoke of evacuation plans for the region and said a "sig alert" would be issued and would announce where to go and what areas to avoid in the event of emergency. He said KOGO radio (AM600) is the channel for emergency broadcasts. Information would also be available at www.sandiego,gov and www.sdcounty.ca.gov.

Barbara Ayers gave an excellent presentation on the Fire and Rescue Department's CERT program and introduced Greg Hom, UC's first to complete CERT training. The goal is to establish CERT teams in all communities. Participants must be at least 18 years old. To date, 260 volunteers have completed CERT training, but so far only two in UC.

Did You Know?...

,,,,In early December 2005, SANDAG, in collaboration with Caltrans, Metropolitan Transit System (MTS), and the California Highway Patrol, will launch a one-year demonstration project to allow buses on MTS route 960 to drive on the freeway shoulder from I-805 and Nobel Drive to SR 52 and Kearny Villa Road during morning and evening rush hours. The pilot project also will test the feasibility of expanding this concept to other freeways in the San Diego region...

...There may not be a **Coaster** station in University City. SANDAG estimated it would cost \$16 million (\$3 million over budget) to build the Nobel station. At the November **University Community Planning Group (UCPG)** meeting, the **UCPG** board voted to divert funds to other projects such as the Super Loop or the Sorrento Valley Coaster station...

...The 11 mile extension of the **trolley** from Balboa Ave. to UCSD and UTC is estimated to cost \$939 million...




