

Swanson Pool set for closure March 5 – June 11

Account set up to receive tax deductible donations to keep the pool open

Last August, as the City's budget woes came to light, it was announced most city operated pools would close for three and one half months on a rotating basis unless the communities raised the needed funds to keep their pool open. Four pools, Clairemont, Ned Baumer Miramar College Aquatic Center, Memorial and Vista Terrace will remain open throughout the year. While two of the pools received grants, an anonymous donor contributed \$102,000 to cover the \$100,000 needed to keep the Clairemont pool open.

Time is running out to keep Swanson Pool from closing March 5 – June 11. It was recently learned that University City would have to raise \$97,000, not the \$80,000 as first thought, to keep Swanson Pool open for the entire period. The funds may be raised through donations, sponsorships, grants and/or rentals. Individuals, organizations and companies may rent the pool for private functions including company parties. If a partial

amount is raised, the pool will remain open as long as the funds allow. An account, Park and Recreation Donation Fund - Swanson Pool, has been set up to receive tax deductible donations. An anonymous donor recently donated \$1000 to start the fund. Please help spread the word.

University City residents formed an assessment district in the early '70's to build the Rec Center and pool. Thousands of people have learned to swim at Swanson Pool, and people of all ages continue to use the pool on a regular basis for exercise, recreation and instruction. Swimmers like Elly Newman, age 73, a participant in the morning water aerobics class for over ten years, are concerned about the pool closing. ... (cont. on pg 2)

With the scheduled closure including Spring Break, UC residents will have to go elsewhere for the swim classes, camp and lifeguard certification normally offered at Swanson Pool -- unless funds are raised to keep it open at least a few weeks longer!

Confused About Those Year-End Library Mailings?

You were in good company if you wondered why you got so many requests for year-end financial support from the Library! With the budget cuts and money problems at the City of San Diego, many of our city services have been cut back significantly. This is definitely the case with library services. Book and other media purchases are limited, and you've probably noticed that the library is open fewer hours, too.

To supplement its budget, the main fund-raising department of the San Diego Public Library sent out a request for donations which you probably received with your water statement in November or December. At about the same time, you may have received a request for a donation from the main office of the Friends of the San Diego Public Library. To further complicate things, you also may have received an envelope for payment of your membership dues to our local Friends of the SDPL.

What's the difference between them,

you might ask. To go right to the bottom line, if you want your funds to go for purchase of equipment, books, and special programs for children and adults at the University Community branch, you need to put "University Community" on your check. This will assure that your donation will be allocated to our University City branch. Without this notation, money goes into the general fund of the San Diego Public Library, to be used for the benefit of all the branches.

When you are asked to renew your membership in the Friends of the SDPL, you'll note that our reply envelope is already pre-stamped with "University Community." Joining the local Friends group assures you of advance notice of our book sales, and you also get the newsletter 3-4 times a year.

Whether you join the Friends, make a donation, or make a purchase at our silent auction or book sale, we appreciate your support of the local library very much.

Construction to Begin on Inner Circle at UC Village Apartments

On October 3, 2000, the City Council approved expansion of the 510 unit senior housing complex, **University City Village Apartments**, located on a 75 acre site between, Governor Dr. and SR-52 west of I-805. Approval was given to add 599 units including 80 assisted living units and fifteen units of affordable senior housing.

The complex is now owned by two separate corporations, and each is entitled to build a portion of the additional units approved. The units in the complex are often referred to as the "inner circle" (University City Village Apartments) and the "outer" (Town Park Villas) reflecting the separate ownership.

The first phase of construction is scheduled to begin at University City Village apartments (inner circle) the end of February or beginning of March. This phase will consist of adding a second story on 3 buildings and the demolition of a building to construct a new recreation building.

There will be approximately 30 new apartment homes in this phase— new 1 bedroom units and 2 bedroom 2 bath units with a loft. The new recreation building will have the offices for manager and leasing along with an exercise room, library, movie theater room, laundry facilities, large kitchen and a huge great room for parties and social events. A new pool and spa will be built next to the recreation building as well as the men's and women's bathroom and shower facilities.

Plans call for approximately 2 more phases consisting of the addition of a second story on approximately 10 more buildings and the construction of 9 new buildings. If construction goes according to plan, the University City Village Apartment portion of the complex should be completed in approximately 3 years.

At press time, no information was available regarding plans for the "outer" apartments, Town Park Villas.






