

The Voters Say "Yes" to Public Education

The voters' approval in November of Propositions 30 and Z was a strong mandate in favor of the reforms and the results that we have been producing in San Diego Unified over the past four years. The opposition clearly made it a referendum against what we have done and we prevailed. The voters in California, and especially San Diego, have clearly said that we have public schools worth investing in.

We can certainly be optimistic about the future of our schools. I am more optimistic than I have ever been in my four years on the board. First, there is a sense of relief. This vote immediately canceled our need to close our schools nearly three weeks early this year, which would have had a significant effect on our student achievement gains. For some time, however, we will still reel from the cumulative effects of several years of cuts, but at least we are starting to move in the right direction.

The main goal for next year will be to bring much needed stability to the district. The kids, the parents and the staff need to recover from the uncertainty that has hung over us the past few years. As funds gradually return to the schools, we must maintain our laser-like focus on student achievement. That means we will have a discussion about the programs that most contribute to that, but it will be a while before that revenue starts to come in.

Our focus on student achievement is one of the reasons that we prioritized spending on technology in the past four years. That investment is paying off with steady gains in student achievement.

Neighborhood Watch News Update

University City owes the 40 existing captains a big "THANK YOU" for their commitment to help provide a safer environment for their neighbors. Those of you who have attended your street neighborhood watch meetings are enlightened and empowered. Knowing what to look for and who to call makes the police department and officer's job easier; they need us to be their extra eyes and ears and report any suspicious activities. Just a reminder: if you see a crime in progress, call 911. If the crime is not witnessed call the non-emergency number at 619-531-2000. Be sure to ask for an incident number so the crime can be traced in the future. Do not call the Northern Division number since it does not generate assistance. It is not to be used for emergency or non emergency problems at anytime.

The number one way to prevent vehicle burglary is to remove everything from the vehicle and lock the doors. If the suspect doesn't see anything in the car and it's locked, then he has no reason to be there. These suspects prowl our streets checking car doors hoping to find one open. If you see anyone who appears out of place, dressed inappropriately, nervous or walking and looking in cars, call the police. If you hear a car or house alarm near by, don't ignore it. Look outside as you may see something irregular to report to the police.

If you do not see one of these signs on your street, there isn't

a neighborhood watch captain yet. Please email me to meet and discuss becoming one. The goal is to cover all the streets so all residents are in the loop. It really feels good when you know what to do to prevent or report a crime.

Safety tip: Did you know that anyone can have a key made for your car just by using your VIN number that is on the dashboard. The suspect, copies the number and calls the auto dealer with the story that he/she lost the key to the car. Later, they come back at their leisure and open the door to take whatever is inside. The solution is to cover the VIN number with dark tape.

Remember, lights are one of the best deterrents in preventing crime along with locking up your home and car. Purchase inside timers that will come on in the evening in the front and back room areas of your home. Dark homes are invitations to burglars. Add timers to your "to do" list for 2013 along with motion detectors for the outside. You can also leave an outside light on all night.

Watch this column in the upcoming months for timely safety tips and reminders. Please stay alert and report suspicious behavior or activities.

Low Flying FA/18 Jet Gets Attention of MCAS Commanding Officer

Colonel Farnam, Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station, Miramar, addressed UCPG on Tuesday, January 8, 2013. Colonel Farnam, a SDSU graduate, took over command at Miramar this past August. After a brief overview of current base activities, he addressed the disabled jets flight paths over University City and expressed his understanding and concern of past occurrences. On November 6th, Election night, an FA-18 jet flew very low over University City around 8:10 p.m. As your UCCA president, I questioned him as to how these flight decisions are originated and directed, and how they can possibly be avoided in the future. Ron Belanger, a retired naval aviator living in University City, and an expert on the current protocol, questioned the colonel as to other possible alternatives to review when and if these situations should occur.

I will be attending an MCAS community leaders' committee meeting later in January to share our community concerns and to seek support from other nearby community groups to forge a strategy that would encourage the Marines/Navy representatives to look into the matter and develop and utilize plans that would minimize the danger to University City residents. Please plan to attend our regularly scheduled February 13, 6:00 meeting for an update on this matter at the UC library on 4151 Governor Drive. If you are interested in joining our efforts in working with MCAS Miramar as we move forward with our campaign for a safer University City, please contact me. You do not need to have military aviation experience, only a need or desire to be part of a reasonable solution to this very serious community concern. Thank you.
