Enhancement Committee Supports Neighborhood

Enhancement Committee is working the City of San Diego Neighborhood Code Compliance senior investigator, Ida Ford, in implementing a plan to make U.C. an attractive neighborhood. For example, many

complaints were received about a couple of homeownwho had violated the code compliance rules by leaving uncompleted construction work. The City reminded the owners of their responsibility, and these neighbors complied. Another person had an open trailer full of debris parked in the same place on a quiet street for months. A letter went out to the person, and the trailer was removed.

Some neighbors may need assistance due to physical limitations, and they should know that the Enhancement Committee will get volunteers to help.
