#### President's Perspective...

Recently, I have become a bit nervous while driving around our community. The sprouting weeds that look like wheat on a midwest farm seem a bit menacing to me. I am still spooked by the memories of our famous fire. When I look at the weeds sprouting almost everywhere, I begin to think of what might happen if someone would carelessly drop a match or cigarette. We have talked with property owners and the city about weed removal. We have had some success on a minor level in having some of the weeds removed from some areas. However, the city is backed up on its workforce and is reluctant to respond to our entreaties for service.

Our most successful venture for getting rid of some of our weeds has been our annual U.C. Clean-up Day, when willing and energetic community volunteers attacked the unwelcome growth with great gusto! A group of neighbors, working together, for limited periods of time to eliminate this blight, seems the most feasible way to succeed in getting rid of the weeds.

So I would like to enlist a group of willing volunteers to become the "Weed Wackers " or "Blight Bashers" of U.C. The plan would be to gather once or twice a month, early on a Saturday morning, pick a designated area, i.e.; a median, growth along the sidewalks or streets, or some other area and eliminate the weeds that are growing there. I would anticipate this activity taking about three hours per morning. All ages would be welcome. Individuals would be free to come and go at their convenience, contributing whatever time and labor they had available on a particular day. My hope is that the old saw "where there's a will, there's a way" would be our motto in eliminating weeds and blight in our neighborhood. One of the main aims of the University Community Association is to help create a cleaner, more beautiful U.C. #### Information about Traffic Citations from **Officer Cummings**

There's an old saying, everyone loves a cop until they get a ticket. The best course of action is to avoid them, at all costs. Why? Being issued a traffic citation will cost you either in time, money or at the least aggravation.

First, let's clear up a major misconception. Police officers do not, repeat, do not have quotas. As with most major police departments, San Diego Police Department does have a Traffic Division. The primary duties of officers assigned to the Traffic Division are collision enforcement and traffic enforcement. These officers usually issue 20 to 30 traffic citations each per day.

So, how to avoid traffic citations? At the risk of sounding overly obvious, the answer is to not violate (break) the traffic laws. A next question might be, "What violations do officers look for?" The laws we see broken most frequently relate to speeding, not using turn signals, red light / stop sign violations, right of way violations and "movement other than indicated" (for example, driving straight in a right turn only lane).

The following is my best advice: Don't speed - know the speed limit of the street you are on and stay under it. Always use you turn signals. This is

extremely important in accident avoidance. Activate your turn signals well in advance of changing lanes or turning to let other drivers know what you are going to do.

If you make a mistake and are in a turn lane and don't want to turn, complete the turn and drive around the block to get to your destination.

Know what and where the white limit line is at intersections. If you roll past the limit line and then stop, at a stop light or stop sign, you have broken the law. At this time, the fine for stop light or stop sign violations is \$271.00. If you do a "California stop" and roll through the intersection in violation of a red light or stop sign, there is little you can say to an officer to explain your driving.

These are just a few of the major violations we see. The California Vehicle Code is approximately 2 1/2 inches thick and filled with innumerable codes, definitions, regulations and laws. My best advice is to periodically read through the DMV Driver's Handbook and honestly look at your driving. We can all do a better job.

#### Did You Know?...

... UC residents joined together In 1975 and voted to assess themselves to build Standley Park. ... The park, recreation building and swimming pool were built in 1975 using funds from the Standley Park Assessment District, San Diego City Schools and the City's Capital Improvement Program. When the project was completed, approximately \$238,000 remained in the assessment fund....


In 1985, a second project added fencing, a tiny tots area, picnic facilities, lighting and additional landscaping, all of which were not in the original project. In 1988, the remaining \$130,000 in the assessment fund was used toward additional improvements: enlarge the rec center's parking lot by about 25 spaces, add a storage building, staff office, enlarge the weight room, upgrade the ball field and tennis court lighting and other miscellaneous improvements ...

... The UC Racket Club was formed to run Standley Park's tennis facility. The UCRC operates and maintains the tennis courts. The great playground equipment at Standley and UC Gardens Park is the result of members of the community spearheading fundraising efforts and working with our Councilman Scott Peters' office and Park and Rec to find ways to make this happen...

... Tall weeds and brush are a fire hazard. When brush is adjacent to homes, brush management is required to protect structures from wildfire. To report weeds and brush, call the San Diego Fire Rescue Dept. at 619-533-4411. The City of San Diego Fire Safety and Brush Management Guide (PDF: 499K) summarizes guidelines for brush management in canyon areas. Access this new guide, prepared after the October 2003 Cedar Fire, at http://www.sandiego.gov/fireandems/pd f/brushpdf.pdf.

... The City received 374 comment letters totaling 3,230 individual comments to the Draft EIR for the north south corridor alternatives (Regents Rd/Genesee). Of these, 1,328 comments were submitted by agencies and organizations; the rest were from individuals. City staff met and established a methodology for responding to the vast number of comments and hopes to establish a timeline in July. All comments will be addressed in the EIR

document.






