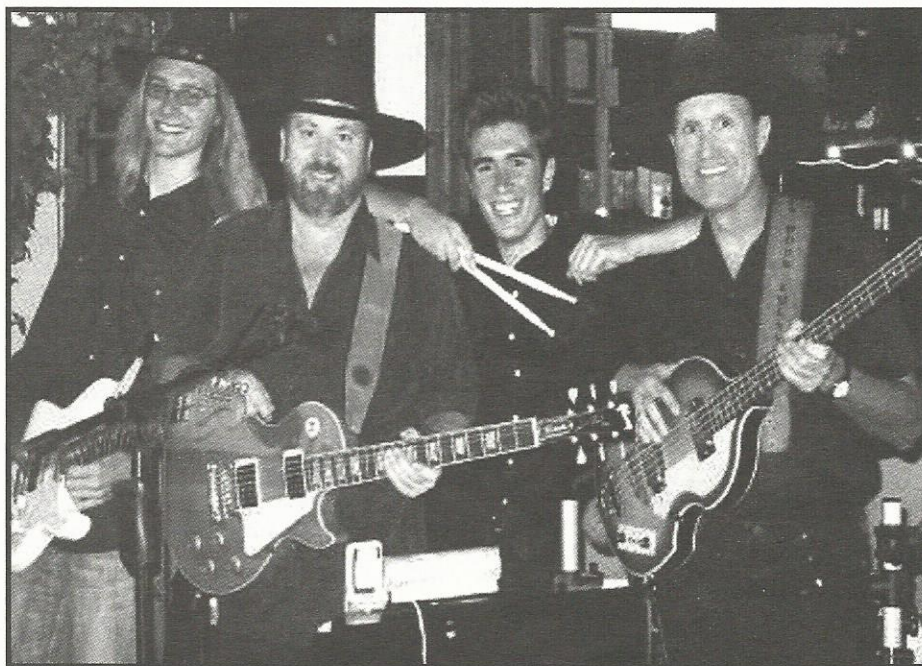

## Long Awaited Final EIR Released

### City Council to hold public hearing

The Final Environmental Impact Report for the University City North/South Transportation Corridor Study has been completed and was released for public review on June 13th. The public will have a minimum 30 day review period due to the large size of the Final EIR. Responses to the written comments that were received during the public review period from November 23, 2004 through April 16, 2005 are included in the Final EIR. In addition, the Final EIR updates the text of the Draft EIR based on comments which were received. All seven alternatives - Regents Rd. bridge, Widening Genesee, Grade Separation on Genesee, Regents Rd. bridge and widening Genesee, Regents Rd. bridge and Grade Separation, intersection improvements, or nothing at all-were evaluated in the EIR. A preferred alternative was NOT identified.

## Airport vote will be on Nov 7<sup>th</sup> ballot

When announcing it's selection of Miramar for joint use at the June 5<sup>th</sup> meeting, **The San Diego Regional Airport Authority** offered the following ballot language for the November 7<sup>th</sup> county wide vote: *'To provide for San Diego's long-term air transportation needs, shall the Airport Authority and government officials work to obtain approximately 3,000 of 23,000 acres at MCAS Miramar by 2020 for a commercial airport, provided necessary traffic and freeway improvements are made, military readiness is maintained without expense to the military for modifying or relocating operations, no local taxes are used on the airport, overall noise impacts are reduced, and necessary Lindbergh Field improvements are completed?'* Go to [www.san.org](http://www.san.org) and click on the airport authority link for information about the entire process.

Councilman Jim Madaffer organized a Town Hall Meeting on June 14<sup>th</sup> at the Tierrasanta Lutheran Church which drew a standing room only crowd from communities surrounding Miramar. A number of UC residents attended and asked questions of the speakers. Councilmen Madaffer and Brian Maisenschein spoke in strong opposition to an airport at Miramar. Council President Scott Peters' chief of staff, Betsy Kinsley, conveyed Councilman Peters' opposition to the Miramar site. Councilman Jim Madaffer sends out regular email reports. Hospital. Frequency is 15 minutes for most of the weekdays, and 30 minutes during nights and weekends. A new stop was added at Old Town Transit Center for trolley and bus connections...

This route will run on Nobel, along I-5, through UCSD and south again along Towne Centre Drive, every 30 minutes from 5:30am to 10:15pm, seven days a week.
