### **EdUCate! Awards \$40,339 in Grants to U.C. Schools**

On May 21st at U.C. High School's Media Center, EdUCate!, the U.C. Foundation for Public Schools. awarded 22 educational grants totaling \$40,339 to Curie, Doyle, and Spreckels Elementary Schools, Standley Middle School, and University City High School. EdUCate! raised the money from last year's "Taste of The Triangle." with funds augmented by private donations and corporate sponsors. Of the grants, \$19,528 were awarded in the Science and Technology category for science activity kits and other science supplies, a color printer, a digital camera with memory sticks, math manipulatives, laptop computers for Special Education instruction, upgrades for computer and science labs, and an interactive tool to teach the use of calculators.

In the Miscellaneous/Interdisciplinary category, \$9,410 was given for interactive reading, math, and science activities; a classroom version of the TV game Jeopardy; an audiometer for a school nurse's office; computer interactive books; and a coin operated

copier for student use. A total of \$6,912 was awarded in the Language Arts category for books to facilitate reading comprehension instruction: multi-cultural books translated in multiple languages; books and cassettes for a language program; books to facilitate guided, shared, and independent reading; and books to enhance Spanish instruction. In the Humanities category, \$2,400 was awarded for CD players and CD's for learning history through lyrics. In the Fine Arts category, \$2,089 was given for art supplies and for software to facilitate the learning of how to write music.

Principals and teachers from the schools attended the May 21st ceremony. EdUCate! also honored 35 teachers and staff retiring this year from the five schools. 
