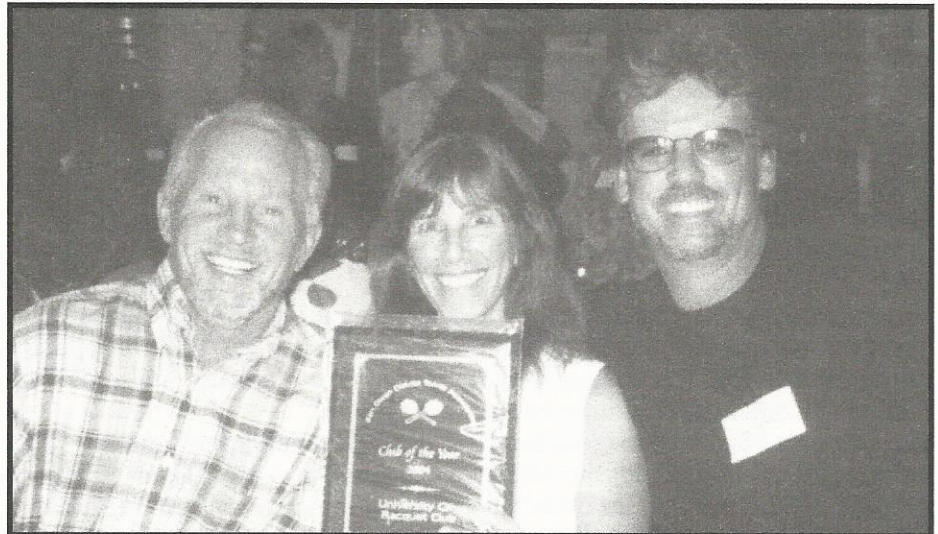

## Tennis Assn. names UCRC Club of the Year

The University City Racquet Club was formed in 1975 to run Standley Park's tennis facility. The City was more than happy to hand this ongoing responsibility over to a group of tennis loving volunteers. Maintenance costs, court resurfacing needs, the replacement of lights, windscreens and tennis nets are borne entirely by the tennis club in exchange for the autonomy of running the courts. UCRC had to assume a liability that the City could not afford.

Since that time, through donations, membership dues and daily fees, the club has thrived and managed to build its own clubhouse. Many tournaments, both open and club variety, have been popular over the years. The San Diego Tennis Association

just named UCRC "Club of the Year" for its tennis development of juniors, after school programs and lessons to tennis players of all ages through head pro, Jim Ferrari. UCRC has also competed for years with its men's and women's teams in San Diego's tennis leagues.

Some UC residents have expressed dissatisfaction over the fact that their money helped build this facility, but they could not use the courts unless they paid a daily fee or joined the club. While sympathetic to such complaints, the reality of the situation is that upkeep of the courts required a system of an ongoing collection of money assuring... (cont. on pg.2)

## UCPG Election March 8<sup>th</sup>

Voting will take place from 5:00 to 8:00p.m. at Forum Hall at UTC

The University Community Planning Group (UCPG) general membership will vote to determine new business and residential representatives in each of the three districts in the community plan area. South University City is District One and has one Resident seat and one Business seat to be filled. There are two candidates for each of the seats.

Per the bylaws, candidates for Resident positions shall be elected by general members registered as Residents; and candidates for Business positions shall be elected by

general members registered as Business Members. General members may vote only for candidates in the same geographic district in which their membership is held.

Candidates vying for a seat in District 1 are: Resident: Dana May and Brian Wilson; Business: Gene Konrad and Thomas Tighe. If you are a member of UCPG, you may drop by Forum Hall at UTC above the Wells Fargo bank anytime between between 5:00 and 8:00 P.M. to cast your ballot. Bring picture I.D. and proof of current residency.

## Draft EIR re-released

Public review and comment period ends 5:00 p.m. April 16<sup>th</sup>

The Draft Environmental Impact Report for the University City North/South Transportation Corridor Study has been re-released and is once again available for public review and comment. Minor errors were found in the distribution of the original draft EIR, resulting in an extension of the public review period. The text of the EIR has been revised in strikeout/underline format to include the necessary corrections. A separate Errata is also available which contains a table listing the pages that have changes. In addition, the Errata contains a copy of all of the revised pages. The extended public review comment period will end at 5 p.m. on April 16<sup>th</sup>.
