## Did You Know...

.....The **City Council** unanimously approved the revised **DIF** (Development Impact Fee) schedule for South U.C at the October 21<sup>st</sup> council meeting. The new fee structure will go into effect on December 16<sup>th</sup>. The DIF fees are paid by developers when permits are pulled for multi-family residential development and commercial or industrial projects in south UC. This revision marks the first time the **South UC DIF** fee structure and needs list had been reviewed since the DIF was first implemented in 1987. The DIF does not cover maintenance items, and there is no provision for inflation. At \$290 per multi-family unit, the **South UC DIF** schedule was the lowest in the city. The **UCPG** and **Land Use and Housing** unanimously approved the revised **DIF** (Development Impact Fee) schedule for **south U.C.** prior to its going to the City Council for approval. Thanks to the combined efforts of **Jennifer Carroll** and **John Tracana** of the city's Facilities Financing staff, **Michelle Blumen** of Councilman Peters office, the **UCPG** DIF subcommittee members and interested local residents, our community has a fee structure that more adequately reflects its needs. ## UCHS Student Earns Scholarship Award

### *Perfect scores on 8 exams.*

Maruti Didwania, a 17 year old senior at University City High School, has been named one of 24 students nationwide who will receive a \$3,000 college scholarship for his performance on Advanced Placement exams. He earned perfect scores on a battery of eight math and science exams.

The Siemens Foundation granted the awards to the students who have the highest cumulative score from exams in biology, calculus, chemistry, computer science, environmental science, two classes of physics, and statistics. About 150,000 students take Advanced Placement math and

science exams each year.

Advanced Placement courses are college-level high school classes. Students who pass end-of-course exams receive college credit. The exams are scored on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 the highest possible score.

Maruti scored 5's on all eight math and science exams. He scored a 5 on the two computer science exams without formal classroom instruction. He studied independently in preparation for those exams. He also received top scores in AP art history and AP U.S. history.
