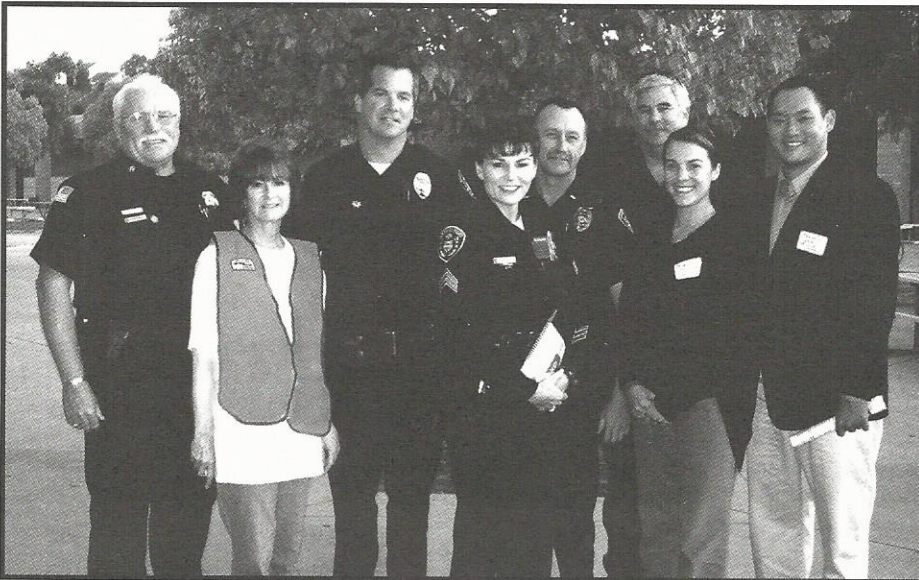

Public Safety Forum a Hit with Attendees

Residents came to UCCA's Public Safety forum seeking information and answers. Per their comments after the meeting, they didn't leave disappointed. UCCA President Hugh Pates introduced Mayor Sanders' representative Stephen Lew, Council President Peters' representative, Madeleine Baudoin, members of SDPD's Northern Division and Metro Arson Strike Team, Battalion Chief Bruce Cartelli and members of Engine Co. 35 of the Fire Rescue Dept. and North Coastal CERT Co-Team Leader Susan Hathaway. A wealth of information was shared through presentations, flyers and answers to questions.

Lt. Chris Ellis who has spent over six years with the Northern Division commented that UC is a good and safe community. Lt. Ellis, Sgt. Andra Brown and Community Relations Officer Charlie Wetzal addressed questions on various topics including Internet safety, auto burglary, mini-dorms and loud parties and drug activity. They said most crimes can be prevented. Be aware of your sur-

roundings. Prevent auto burglaries by keeping your windows closed, doors locked and valuables out of sight. Don't give them anything to steal.

Lt. Ellis said residents disturbed by college students' loud parties should call the non-emergency police # 619-531-2000, and a policeman will be dispatched. Affected residents should also contact the university the students attend. Community Officer Wetzal said residents can contact him at rwetzal@pd.sandiego.gov regarding problems in their neighborhood.

Detective Kramer, a member of the Metro Arson Strike Team, addressed the issue of the two pipe bombs that were exploded in University City-one in a mailbox on Stresemann in July and the other next to a garage door on Dennison Av. early this fall. Police have a video tape of the vehicle involved in the Dennison case but no license plate number. Det. Kramer asked that anyone with information call Crime Stoppers at 888-580-TIPS.

Fire issues addressed at Safety Forum ...*(cont from pg 1)*

Battalion Chief Bruce Cartelli spoke of the danger of carbon monoxide poisoning as the heating season begins. He reminded the audience of the importance of cleaning and/or changing furnace filters and noted SDGE will come out to check furnaces. He spoke of Christmas tree safety and warned not to burn Christmas trees or wrapping paper in the fireplace. No outdoor burning is allowed, except for food. Unattended candles are a major cause of structure fires (The recent fire at Standley Middle School is an example.), but many fires are started by electronics in the home. Laptop computer batteries generate a lot of heat and can cause a fire if the laptop is left on couches, cushions or carpeting.

University City presently has one fire station located in North UC. Resources are shared, and the unit with the most direct approach responds. A commu-

nity plan amendment will permit more fire stations in the area, but funding is needed to build, staff and operate them. An additional station is slated for North UC. Medical emergencies account for most of the fire rescue department calls. Paramedics are on every fire truck.

Inattentive drivers cause most of the problems for fire fighters responding to emergencies. Drivers are stopping in place instead of pulling to the right so the fire trucks can get around the traffic. The firefighters acknowledged that fire trucks and ambulances cross over the medians on Genesee, driving the opposite direction in the lane to get around stalled traffic. The firefighters stressed the need for drivers to be aware and not talk on cell phones in their cars. Let's do our part to help our fire and police personnel help us.

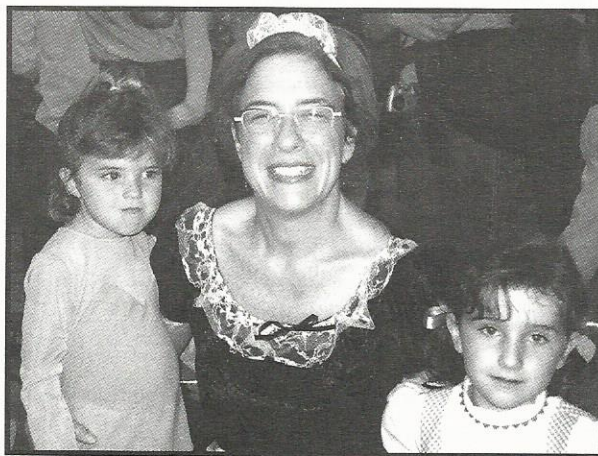
Volunteers Needed to Plan Sunday Summer Concert Series
