

# Tips on Trash and Recycling Collection

University City residents have often asked UCCA to remind neighbors of responsibilities of being a good neighbor. The City of San Diego goes one step further with a Municipal Code enforcement. For example, trash containers should be stored in a secure location not visible from public right-ofway, such as behind a fence or in your backyard or garage. All containers must be removed from point of collection by 6 p.m. on your collection day. The containers should be placed out by 7 a.m. on the day of collection.

Failure to remove containers is not just a violation of a San Diego Municipal Code, but it is also not a neighborly thing to do. To keep U.C. litter free and clean, remember you can't pack trash or recyclables tightly in your container. Trash should be bagged or wrapped before placing it in the trash container. To report damaged, lost or stolen containers, or to purchase an additional container, call the Environmental Services Department at (858) 694-7000.

# Police Officer, Fire Captain Address Concerns at September UCCA Meeting

UCCA now meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. That may account for the small turnout on September 10th. However, the program, put together by 2nd vice president Hugh Pates, was a hit with the audience, Ralph Cummings, our community police officer, fielded questions about crime in U.C. # Automated External Defibrillator Donated to Standley Park

Local U.C. resident Grea Zinser got online the day after Jerry Fort, U.C. Little League coach, died of a heart attack at Standley Park during a baseball practice July 9th. Zinser contacted the Over 35 League basketball team members who play at Standley Park year round Sunday mornings, specifically the ones who work in healthcare. He was looking for an A.E.D., an Automated External Defibrillator. Zinser is the organizer of the basketball group that includes men and women from 35 to 65 years old, primarily U.C. residents. Dr. Martin Griglak, another U.C. resident and member of the league, was able to help Zinser find an A.E.D, through an emergency room doctor colleague from Scripps Memorial Hospital.

An Automated External Defibrillator is an easy-to-use automated device, which delivers a life-saving electric shock to the heart to halt rapid and chaotic heart activity, commonly known as sudden cardiac arrest. A.E.D. restores normal heart rhythm and is designed to be used by non-medical personnel.

The A.E.D. Dr. Griglak found was not exactly like the type the Park and Recreation Department uses. However, Zinser was able to work through Park and Rec Public Information Officer, Stacey LoMedico, to take the donation of the machine as a trade in value with the contracted party the Park and Recreation works with. In turn, the company presented Standley Park with a machine compatible with the ones used by Park and Rec citywide.

Zinser quickly credits Dr. Griglak for his help and Stacey LoMedico for moving the project along. Sarah Anderson, acting director of Standley Park, is anxious to get her staff trained for the arrival of the life saving machine, A.E.D. It should be a comfort to everyone in University City who uses the Standley Rec Center to know the technology is available as another lifesaving tool. University City is grateful to Greg Zinser and Dr. Marty Griglak for their efforts in securing this gift of life.


