Looking Ahead in 2011

CCA petitioned Sherri Lightner's office to include the intersection of Governor and Genesee as part of the resurfacing project on Genesee, and Jesse Mays reports that the intersection will now be included. Patching the roughest spots on Genesee is first and then the resurfacing will occur. ..Thanks to the many U.C. residents who have sent donations to the Transformer Box Art Project. This UCCA project is almost complete. Mobil gas station donated \$100 recently, joining many other businesses. By the way, United Oil, another sponsor and owner of World gas station has added some attractive landscaping at the World station...UCCA lost out on an American Society of Landscape Architects' community grant of \$5,000 to replace blacktop medians in front of Marketplace with stamped concrete. Since it is a public right-of-way, the ALSA committee felt it would be unrealistic to complete the project within six months and budget. Although the project would enhance the community, other applicants demonstrated a higher benefit to the community through enhancement of 'pedestrian type' public spaces...UCCA will try again next year. In the meantime, one way of getting things done in a community is to develop a Maintenance Assessment District. However, no person has stepped forward to chair a MAD. Interested? Contact the new beautification chair in January...Each morning one local lady walks up and down Governor picking up trash. She doesn't want publicity, but she serves as a good role model for all of U.C.



majority of voters supported Proposition J, but unfortunately, we did not reach the required

2/3 threshold. We are facing an addition \$140 million of cuts next year, which will have a direct effect on our schools. Potential cuts include athletics, counselors, nurses, librarians, vice principals, off campus programs, further reduction of central office staff, elimination of full day kindergarten, transportation and much more.

We have experienced a great start to the 2010-2011 school year in University City. Mike Price, former UC High Principal is now the Area Superintendent for the UC Cluster, which consists of UC High, Standley, Currie, Spreckels, and Doyle. The UC Cluster Council meets on the fourth Monday of each month at the UC High Media Center from 4:30 PM to 6:00 PM. The council consists of parents, students, teachers, and principals from all five schools. All members of the UC community are invited to attend. UC schools are continuing to move up in their performance.

The UC Cluster Council is working closely with Educate to meet the needs of UC schools in these tight budget times. We must be vigilant as our new governor and legislature make decisions about public school funding. Governor Brown will release his proposed budget in January.

Reducing Water Use with Your Landscape By Dylan Wells

hough California received above average rainfall this past year, we are still in a drought. San Diegans are among the most impacted because our local rainfall does not nearly suffice the population's water needs. Rather, most of

our water is pumped from the Colorado River through hundreds of miles of pipe. Due to our increasing dependence on out-of-state water sources, it makes both environmental and economic sense that we all make changes to wasteful water practices.



Did you know that over 60% of water consumed in San

Diego goes to our landscapes? That's over 90 gallons a day, per person! Additionally, a great deal of that water is wasted, either as run off or evaporation. On average, roughly 50% of water emitted by sprinklers never makes it to the roots of the plants it is intended to nourish. With a few simple steps, we can do our part to significantly reduce water waste, and make our landscapes a little greener.

UC based Revolution Landscape is at the forefront of sustainable





landscapes in San Diego, largely due to the use of the latest in drip irrigation technology, alongside a number of sustainable farming practices and techniques. Something as simple as adding 2-3" of woodchip or compost mulch to your landscape has all the benefits of improving the health of

your plants, reducing water evaporation, and minimizing water runoff. According to the San Diego County Water Authority, adding 2-3" of mulch can reduce water loss 20-30 gallons per watering cycle. Pair that with the 20-25 gallons saved per watering cycle by installing drip irrigation, and you have just become one of the


