. . . . Large Crowd continued from page 1 secretary, and Ginny Charvat took over as treasurer after serving as membership chair. Over 100 people attended. Barry Bernstein brought the movers and shakers to the UCCA meeting, starting off with Councilwoman Lightner who gave an update of issues critical to U.C. residents. She handed out commendations to the outgoing UCCA board. Captain Brian Ahern of the Northern Division of San Diego Police Department welcomed emails and phone calls from residents with concerns about crime in University City, although this is one of the safest communities in the city. Board of Education and U.C. resident, John Lee Evans, encouraged the audience to support the schools that are dramatically affected by the budget crisis. Fire Station #35 reminded the audience to purchase a carbon monoxide sensor and change batteries in our smoke detectors. Juan Lias from the Miramar Marine Air Base invited the community to visit the new Veterans' Cemetery on the base, as well announcing plans for the Marine Air anniversary.

UTC Manager, Ryan Perry, presented a Power Point on the UTC Westfield Shopping Mall expansion and fielded questions from the audience. Perry believes that this expansion should really delight the local community with a new ArcLight movie theater and a huge expansion of 24-Hour Fitness, as examples. Anne Steinberger of SANDAG outlined the North City trolley route and its impact on U.C. Janay Kruger, the chair of the University City Planning Group, covered many topics, including a possible new city ordinance allowing for small livestock to be allowed in selected urban communities. The City Council will take up this controversial topic in early 2012. UCCA Beautification chair Sandy Lippe briefly touched on the Governor medians that should be replanted in 2012 once the City gives final approval. Closing out the night's program was City staffer Andy Field who oversees the MAD program(Maintenance Assessment District). Under the direction of Barry Bernstein, University City Community Association is investigating MAD for improving the medians on Regents and Genesee and other areas of our

Focus on Our Streets By Sherri Lightner

As you know, one of my top priorities on Council has been improving the quality of our streets in District 1. While much remains to be done, we have made some significant progress in upgrading the roads throughout University City.



Here are some recent accomplishments:

- The resurfacing of La Jolla Village Drive was completed in mid-November.
- The resurfacing of Nobel Drive was completed in early November.
- Up next is the resurfacing of Genesee between Genesee Cove and Executive Drive. I'll keep you posted on the status of this street resurfacing project.

By the time you read this, my office will have completed its second Pothole Roundup. The event, which is scheduled for Nov. 28, is designed to fill potholes throughout the district. When I hosted a similar event last spring, City staff filled about 400 potholes in just one week. I also continue to push for the type of street improvements that will help traffic flow throughout University City.

The reconfiguration of the onramps to I-805 at La Jolla Village Drive, a \$19 million project, is under budget and on schedule to be completed before year's end.

We will also be doubling the number of lanes on the Genesee Bridge over the I-5 and adding a new bike path between Sorrento Valley and Voight Drive. This project, which is scheduled to begin construction in 2013, will improve commute times by making it easier to access freeway onramps and provide a great new recreation opportunity.



Pedestrian Safety

My son attends UC High school. While walking to school on Oct. 27, he was struck by a motorist at about 7 am. My son was crossing Governor Dr. at the pedestrian crossing at the Radcliffe Dr intersection; the motorist was driving south on Radcliffe Dr., and made the left turn (going east) on Governor. Fortunately, my son did not sustain major bodily injuries; he has a large bruise on his leg.

That is a dangerous intersection: several of my friends have mentioned almost being hit, and I too had a narrow miss. In the morning, the eastern sun is bright and blinding, making it hard to see at that intersection. Also, motorists are often hurrying to catch the green light, and rather than slowing down, I have noted many drivers speeding up as they approach the intersection. First, I would appeal to motorists to please drive carefully and allow room for pedestrians, especially



at the Radcliffe Dr./Governor Dr. intersection which has substantial foot traffic owing to its proximity

to Standley Middle School. Secondly, I would request the City of San Diego Transportation Office to only allow left turns on a green arrow or explore options to make that intersection safer for pedestrians. Needless to say, I am very grateful that my son is ok; I am also thankful that the motorist stopped and asked if my son was alright. I sincerely hope the motorist is also thankful for the wake-up call, and will drive more safely in the future.

If you're going to shop, shop smart!

Avoid Online Scams When You're Shopping for the Holidays

Every year we see staggering new statistics about how many people are buying gifts online instead of braving traffic, long lines, and parking nightmares at brick-and-mortar stores. During the holidays, many online retailers will also offer breaks on shipping costs—so the advantages of less physical hassle, no sales tax, and potentially free or cheap shipping make online shopping pretty appealing. However, the risks involved in online shopping are persistent as ever. Here are a few key ways you can protect yourself.

- Use a virtual account number This is a service that most credit cards now offer. Here's how it works: Log onto your credit card account and with one click you can generate a random credit card number that makes it virtually impossible for anyone to steal your account number while shopping online. When your virtual number is generated, simply enter it into the merchant's form and complete your purchase without revealing your actual card number. This virtual credit card number is only valid for a short period of time-long enough for the retailer to process your transaction, which will be charged to your real credit card account. But if a retailer stores that number and a hacker later breaks into their system, the number will be useless. Please note: Virtual account numbers cannot be used for purchases that require you to show your credit card at time of pick-up (e.g., movie tickets, etc.), because the account numbers will not match.
 - Make sure you're shopping on a secure site Look an address bar that turns green, the closed-padlock icon and/or a URL that starts with https://. That means your transaction is encrypted. (Encryption is a security measure that scrambles data as it traverses the Internet.)
 - <u>Card information</u> This is almost certainly a scam. Every year millions of emails go out from hackers pretending to be eBay or PayPal customer service and asking consumers to provide information that the actual service already possesses. If you're worried that a retailer really has failed to process your order, go to the site and look up your account or contact their customer service center—don't click on a link in email that could redirect to a dummy site,
 - **Look for signs that the business is legitimate** Buy from reputable stores and sellers. Here are some ways to check: Find out what other shoppers say. Sites like Epinions.com or BizRate have customer evaluations which can help you determine a company's legitimacy.





HOME SAFETY TIPS

- ★ Be extra cautious about **locking doors and windows** when you leave the house, even if you will only be gone for a few
- ★ If you're out for the evening: Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone's home.
- ★ Don't display gifts in view of your windows or doors.
- ★ When going on trips or just out for the evening, use automatic timers to turn indoor lights on and off to make it appear you are
- ★ Consider informing your neighbors if you will be away from your house for an extended period of time; ask them to watch your house and to park in your driveway occasionally.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspapers stopped or have a trusted neighbor collect them.
- ★ Immediately after Christmas, mark all new gifts with your California Driver's license or I.D. number.
- ★ If you have **house guests**, familiarize them with your security precautions and make sure they follow them.
- ★ Be sure any holiday decorations are **child-proofed** (secure trees, double check the safety of electrical decorations).
- Don't advertise what you got for Christmas by putting the boxes out on trash day. Break the boxes down and put

them in dark trash bags or take them to the dump vourself.

SHOPPING SAFETY TIPS

- ALWAYS BE AWARE OF WHO IS AROUND YOU. **KEEP YOUR EYES PEELED!**
- **DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING VISIBLE IN YOUR CAR.** Be sure to lock the car, close the windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- Shop early in the day to avoid excessive crowds. If you must shop in the evenings, shop with a friend.
- * Keep your money safe.
 - o Carry your purse in front of you, next to your body, with the purse flap against you.
 - o Carry your wallet in your front pocket.
 - o Carry only the charge cards you will need.
 - o Do not carry large sums of cash.
- When charging an item, ensure you get your credit card back.
- Don't overload yourself with packages and don't allow your attention to be distracted from your purse or packages.
- **Park in well-lit areas,** as close as possible to store entrances.
- Be particularly aware of persons in the parking lot, especially anyone near your car.
- Try not to park next to large vehicles (such as vans, trucks and SUVs) where people could surprise you.
- Shopping with kids? Teach your children to go to a store clerk and ask for help if you become separated in a store or shopping mall.
- Don't hesitate to **notify store** security if you see suspicious
- activity. **\$** If you have to wait for a ride, wait in a busy, well-lit place.
- If you are a victim of a crime, report it to the police

immediately.
