
Summer Concerts

Senior Traffic Engineer Answers Questions from Concerned Citizens

Senior Traffic Engineer Ahmed Aburahmah, on the job for only 3 months in San Diego, got his initiation at the June 20th UCCA meeting when residents railed against traffic jams on Genesee and Governor. Cars speeding along Governor Dr., especially in the stretches east of Agee and west of Regents was another concern expressed. Aburahmah said the City has hired a consultant to take traffic counts in several areas of University City when school is in session. He will then decide how to solve the problems U.C. pedestrians and drivers face every day.

A UCCA traffic subcommittee has been formed to work with Aburahmah so he gets the resident perspective as well as the consultant's perspective. Because our local schools are open to residents outside the community, traffic at Curie, Spreckels, Standley, and U.C. High has escalated the last few years. Genesee has become a source of frustration during peak hours when it is more like a parking lot than a roadway. His goal is to build an interpretive and botanical project.
