Did You Know? . . .

The UCPG (University Community Planning Group) meets the second Tuesday of the month at Forum Hall in UTC at 6pm. The meeting agenda is distributed one week beforehand and is generally posted at both libraries in UC as well as the city's website www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/profiles/university/agendas.shtml. (Minutes are also posted at the same website.) The agenda for the July 14th meeting had not been determined as we went to press, but the following were among items listed last month as **potential agenda items for July**: UC Village (senior apartment complex), synagogue Governor/Gullstrand. The UCPG will not meet in August.

...If you are interested in becoming a member of **CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)**, the next six-week training academy (Academy 23) begins **October 1st and runs through November 7th**. Classes are free; class supplies are offered at cost. A flexible schedule allows students to attend either the Thursday evening (6 p.m. – 10 p.m.) or Saturday morning classes (8:30a.m. – 12:30p.m.) Subjects include **Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety, Disaster Medical Operations, Search and Rescue, CERT Organization, Incident Command System, Disaster Psychology, and Terrorism**. Training includes classroom and practical activities. The final class, Saturday, November 7th, is a disaster drill in which all students participate in a

demonstration of their newly acquired skills. For more information about CERT, class syllabus and registration, check the **CERT** website, www.sandiego.gov/fireandems/cert/index.shtml. CERT graduates participate in teams throughout the city. University City CERT grads are members of the **North Coastal CERT team**... 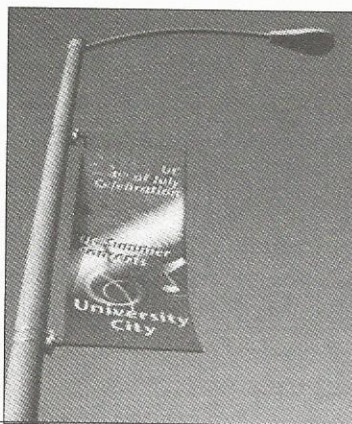

UCCA Receives Concerns About Eyesores in the Community

University City Community Association's by-laws ensure and promote the civic, social, educational, and recreational development and improvement of University City. Most residents, renters and owners, take pride in this community, encouraging aesthetics in our neighborhood that help maintain a quality of life and value to our homes. At a recent UCCA beautification meeting, several residents raised concerns about code compliance standards in the neighborhood. After much discussion, a volunteer subcommittee, Barbara Gellman, Marcia Sarnow, and Art Wolfkind, drafted a form letter to address issues of concern. Rather than automatically turn to Code Compliance and our City Council representative, U.C. wants to encourage neighbor to neighbor communication without appearing meddling and over-reactive.

- Weeds taking over a yard
- Trash left in the front yard (furniture, filled trash bags, appliances, trash bins as examples)
- Dead, overgrown or untrimmed bushes and trees
- Collapsing fences and gates
- Peeling paint
- Old boats, cars, rusting RV's
- Metal or POD type storage containers visible from the street and mobile billboards.

We understand that not everyone has the means or ability to provide upkeep of their home, and our community is willing to help. 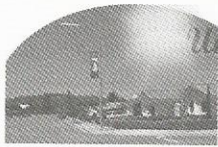

The counter on the home page, just underneath the picture of Governor Drive and Genesee Avenue, shows, to date, 3457 visitors, that is about 5 visitors a day, 3 new and 2 returning. Given the University City population of 34,891 (data in the 2000 U.S. Census, next census in 2010), minus babies and children, this would mean roughly, 20% have visited the site in one year!

First of all, you can read about the current U.C. news and events or consult and save a copy of current or past newsletters (3 years worth of archives). You can also write to the newsletter editor or webmaster (on the home page, click on the link editor@ucca-news.org or webmaster@ucca-news.org) or to the association using the **Contact us** page. You can check the community calendar as well and even add your own events (on the home page, click on the button **View my Calendar** on the left).

You can check on our classifieds and, again, add yours (on the home page, click on the link **Classified** on the left). Or learn about schools, libraries, malls, parks, canyons, pool or recreation, plus the community events brought to life by the UCCA, such as 4th of July Celebration, Summer concerts, Christmas Tree Lighting,... following the links all way down in the page. You can then vote for your favorite band, let us know if the pool must remain open or rate the site respectively on the summer concerts, pool and home pages. And, on the home page again, check the today's cartoon and headlines or find out what happened that day in history - you could be pleasantly surprised! Or yet you can simply enjoy some gorgeous U.C. pictures. So, hey, when was the last time you visited the UCCA Internet site? Because, it is you that make the University City site... more than a site!

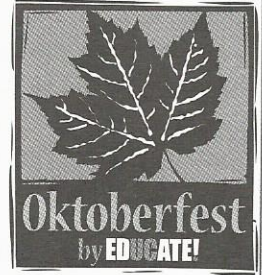
