PROPERTY TAX INCREASE FOR SOUTH U.C. RESIDENTS?

(Is it worth it to you...or just ignore it?)

n order to improve our now very dilapidated, distressed, and weed-filled medians, (north from 52 on Genesee and Regents Road), a remedy is being suggested that would mean an increase in your yearly property tax bill. The city-approved-process is called Maintenance Assessment District (MAD). The amount of increase would be based on residents' choice of stamped concrete, approximately \$200. 00 for each residence paid over five years or for landscaped medians upwards to \$400.00 for each residence paid out for specified years. Presumably these assessments, as part of your total yearly property tax bill, will be tax deductible. I will be at the UCCA booth at our

Definitions of Crimes:

- Auto Burglary: theft of articles from a motor vehicle.
- <u>Assault</u>: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury.
- <u>Narcotics</u>: Any unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs may result in an arrest or citation.
- <u>DUI</u>: The driving or operation of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics. This includes operating a motor vehicle, train, boat, and so on.
- <u>Vandalism</u>: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or by any other such means as specified by local law.
- <u>Residential Burglary</u>: The unlawful entry of a residential structure to commit a felony or a theft. Residential structures include, but not limited to, apartments, cabins, condominiums, dwelling houses and houseboats (used as permanent dwelling). Any House trailer or other mobile unit that is permanently fixed and used as a residence is also considered a residential structure.

Some Interesting Information

n response to the article, "Are You Curbing Your Dog?" by Angela Neste. I too thought people were not cleaning up after their dogs, and given the area, this was most unusual. Although nothing is ever

for sure, the fecal matter on the west side sidewalk of Gullstrand is most similar to what is on the 'coyote' path that runs through the canyon and often has bits of orange/red 'berries'. It is also often seen where the coyotes are known to come out of the canyon and brush and onto the sidewalk. Perhaps, there is an occassional one or two that

are from dogs, but being a dog owner in this neighborhood, I would find that unlikely. Other dog walkers have also asked me if I had noticed how many coyote droppings there had been. However, they haven't been as active lately.



To University City Neighbors:

An example of a growing UC problem occurred on a recent Monday AM trash-day. A bevy of loud crow activity beckoned me outside where the sky was filled with screaming crows, hovering around a dead bird, being devoured by a stray dog in the street. What caught my eye immediately was an overload of trash cans at my neighbor's house on Weller, a UCSD student rental. An enormous number of eggs—raw and cooked—were broken and distributed on driveways, sidewalks, rooftops and the grass of surrounding neighbor property. Adding to the mess were hundreds of partially empty fast-food boxes blowing everywhere!

Besides UC being disrupted by careless students and lax landlords, there are significant health issues to consider. Dead birds, especially crows, are known to carry West Nile Virus, easily transmitted to humans for whom it is also deadly! Second, egg shells and eggs (uncooked or partially cooked) are notorious for Salmonella bacterium—another Public Health reportable disease—a known cause of food poisoning and severe illness. Third, stray dogs, carriers of diseases such as rabies, that prowl neighborhood property—this one nearly came in my front door!

On this occasion, I found the best recourse was to contact the home-owner, whose cell phone number was available. However, cases of code violation should be reported to appropriate city officials. Contacts by phone or email include: Trash and Environment (619) 236-4250, (858) 694-7000. Reports to the SD Public Health or Environmental Health Department are required; Environmental Health (800) 253-9933, and www.sandiego.gov/nccd






