City Attorney Candidate Forum Draws Large Crowd



The city attorney political forum on May 14th drew the largest audience of any event UCCA has put on at the high school. All five candidates showed up and each one scored some points with the interested voters who listened politely. The League of Women Voters moderator, Betty Weinberger, did an excellent job in fairly posing the questions to the candidates: incumbent Mike Aguirre, challengers Judge Jan Goldsmith, lawyer Amy Lepine, Councilman Brian Maienschein, and Council President Scott Peters. Two screeners, League member, June Greenwald, and UCCA's Hugh Pates, screened the questions written on 3 X5 cards. Emmett Greenwald was the timer.

A group of AP government students under the guidance of UCHS teacher Michele Fournier joined the adults in the audience to see democracy in action. The students seemed to enjoy the spirited answers to well written questions. Each candidate demonstrated a keen sense of humor that kept the evening dialog entertaining as well as academic. At one point in the evening, the tall UCCA banner fell after being taped to the wall next to the stage. Mr. Maienschein was in the middle of an important point in his answer and he quickly retorted: "Those must have been powerful words of mine."

Mr. Aguirre, as the incumbent, was challenged by each of the candidates, as were the sitting council members, Scott Peters and Brian Maienschein, for their parts in the pension debacle. However, the evening event was noteworthy for its civility on the part of the candidates and the members of the audience.

Did You Know?...

...An easy way to determine which plastic items can go into your blue curbside recycling bins is to follow he advice of "Bonita Blue Bin" in the Environmental Services Dept. Winter 2007 Curbsider newsletter:

"Recycle all your plastic bottles, and jars, except those that contained hazardous materials (motor oil, antifreeze, pesticides, solvents, etc.). If your plastic item is not a bottle or a jar, it does not go in the blue bin. By following this rule, 90 percent of the plastic you put in your blue bin will be recyclable, and the rest will be pulled out for disposal." Your recreation council will be providing weekly Sunday concerts at Standlev Park this summer. UC High School Athletic Fields.

After ten years in the making (and suffering) the San Diego Unified School District and University City High School and Foundation have reached an agreement to renovate the upper athletic fields at the high school this summer. The renovation will include the installation of new water lines from the Robbins Street entrance gate to the lower athletic fields. In addition, a pump will be installed to boost the water pressure to provide sufficient pressure and flow to adequately water the upper fields (soccer, softball, field hockey, and baseball). Fields are going to be re-seeded and leveled. Sprinkler heads will be repaired or replaced and irrigation lines repaired, replaced or reinforced as necessary.

This work, which will provide safe and resilient surfaces for both students and community groups, will commence on Tuesday, June 17, 2008 and will not be completed until August 22, 2008. In order to give the grass and improvements the best chance of "taking root" and lasting through the years, we have to close the Upper Fields to all use, both community and school, beginning on the 17th of June until the 25th of August. As this is a combined effort between our Foundation, the school and the district, I am asking all community members to respect these restrictions this summer and to stay off of the upper playing fields for reasons during the summer season. We want to be able to provide good surfaces for youth and adult.

The University City High School Grad Nite Committee is busy preparing for Grad Nite to be held in the high school gymnasium on June 16. This all night alcohol/drug free event is designed to keep our graduating seniors and the community safe on a night that is potentially dangerous for them. This also creates a lifelong memorable experience for our 435 graduates.

This huge undertaking of transforming the school gymnasium into a Roman Coliseum is only possible with the effort of many people from the community. We provide many entertaining activities, food and prizes throughout the entire night. As you can imagine, the cost for such an event is very significant.

We are a non-profit organization who looks to the community for donations of money, food, prizes (gift cards or specialty items) and volunteer time. Volunteers are needed during the set-up on June 12 and 13 from 5:00-9:00pm and all day Saturday, June 14 from 8:30am and take-down on Saturday, June 21 from 8:30am. Even one hour of your time would be gratefully appreciated.
