"Can you help get rid of this eyesore?" is a question frequently posed to the UCCA board. Residents attending the October UCCA meeting learned about code violations and the 12 agencies handling them. When Gibb Vong of the city's Neighborhood Code Compliance Dept. (NCCD) mentioned the city empowers communities through self-help programs, he sparked immediate interest. University City will soon join the ranks of 25-30 other community Volunteer Code Enforcement groups working with the NCCD to resolve simple violations. The city will certify and indemnify the group

## First WURST, a Funfilled Octoberfest

The Man Behind the Name

Do you know who the school and recreation center were named after? William Harrison Standley, a naval officer and diplomat, was born on December 18, 1872 in Ukiah, California. He graduated from the Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland in the middle of the class of 1895. He married Evelyn Curtis in 1898 and fathered five children.

Standley distinguished himself in his long naval career. He rose in the ranks to become director of fleet training and assistant chief of naval operations. He was promoted to rear admiral in 1927 and vice admiral in 1932. In May of 1933, he advanced to full admiral and chief of naval operations. He often acted as secretary of the navy because of the illof Secretary Swanson. ness Standley retired from the navy in 1937 at the age of sixty-four.

He was appointed ambassador to the Soviet Union in 1942 and resigned in 1943. He became a dedicated foe of communism. Standley, who became director of Pan American Airways, died in San Diego on October 25, 1963. Standley Park and Standley Middle School proudly share Admiral Standley's name. In addition, he added safety enhancements to the three existing bleachers by building back supports for the rows. Spencer's project was to improve land-scaping at Standley Park and stop erosion on the hillside behind the park by planting 50 plants and shrubs, adding tons of mulch to the site and then cleaning up the tot sandbox.


