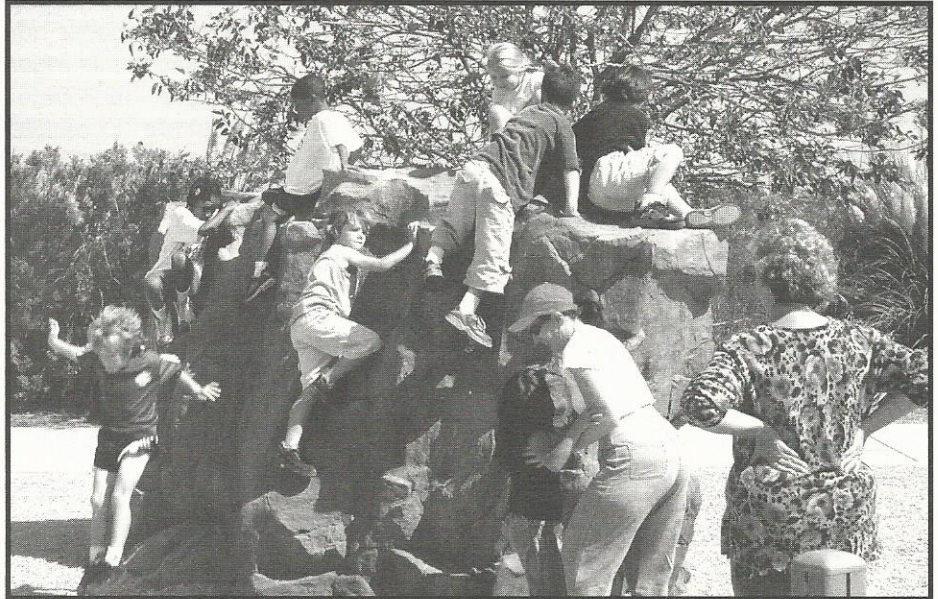

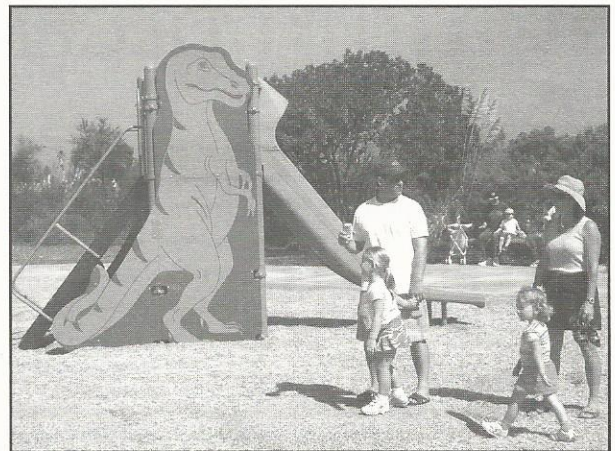
## Standley Park News Breakfast with Santa

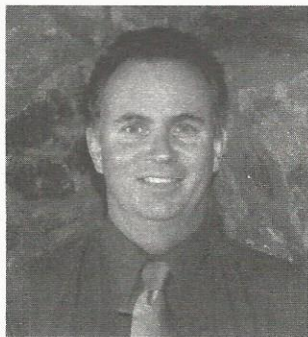

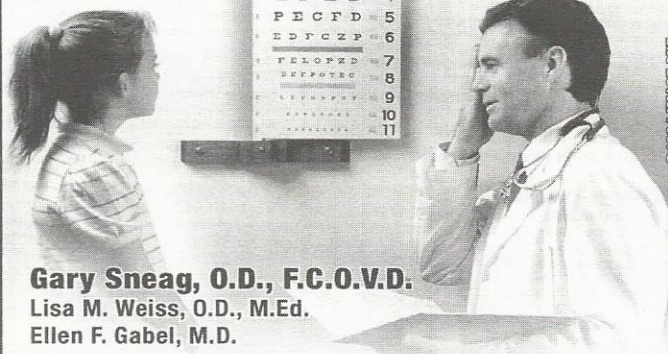

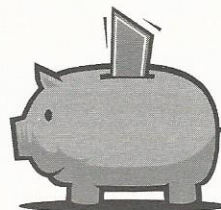
