Volunteer Store Going out of Business

University City has been threatened with the closure of our post office, our library, and Swanson pool. We've endured a reduction of hours and staff at Standley Park Recreation Center. We now face limitations on all City provided services. However, an overlooked community service is in jeopardy of dying; volunteer boards. Two groups of particular concern are the University City Community Association and the Standley Park Recreation Council. Both of these organizations operate with skeleton crews of volunteers of which most have served for more than a decade. I am sure all were happy to commit to a few years of service and hoped long ago that other residents would feel the same. Unfortunately, there is no depth to our bench, no reinforcements on the way, nor cavalry coming to save the day. We now have a small and exhausted faction of what was once an influential and optimistic fighting force in promoting beneficial events and activities for University City. Volunteers humbly function without wages, financial compensation, or promise of an afterlife. The sole driving force is the immediate benefit to the community, mostly for the children. University City has rallied to save the cherished institutions previously mentioned. Why not make a commitment to strengthen the ranks of the two entities which affect a majority of the social functions provided free to UC? Make a promise to yourself to attend the next UCCA meeting on Monday, November 9, at the Library or the next Recreation Council meeting. The FUN you save may be your own.

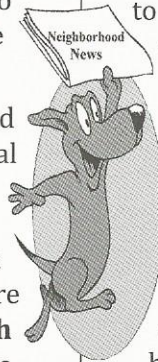

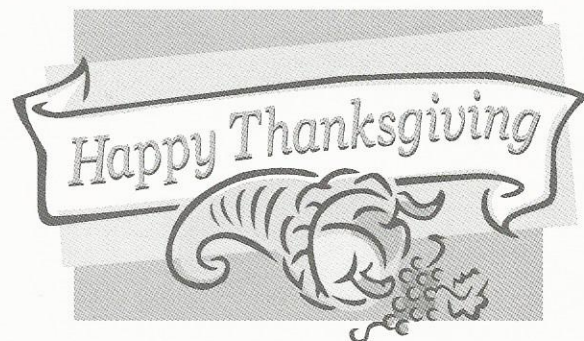
Neighborhood News . . .

The Marketplace manager Keri also said a sandwich shop is being considered for the space next to Starbucks, but she wouldn't comment on what store will go into the post office complex when it moves to Curves space...Jane Reilly continues to serve her customers and friends at Postal Annex even though the store just sold. Jane has always been a good friend of the U.C. community and helped out with the drive to keep the post office open by providing postcards directed to Congressman Bilbray and the Postmaster. All you needed was a stamp and your signature. A transplant from Paterson, New Jersey, Jane loves to meet and greet the folks who drop into Postal Annex...Final comment about the post office; U.C. is blessed with the caring clerks who show concern for the community too. Keep using the post office so that business will increase and we won't



face another closure in the future... Helen Lebowitz of Friends of the Library is going to teach a class in calligraphy for young students in January. Calligraphy is the art of fine handwriting. The class will be open to ages 10-13, with 6 to 8 students, and will be funded by Friends of the Library ...Morris Casuto, regional director of the Anti-Defamation League and a longtime U.C. resident, showed up at Chabad and Our Mother of Confidence Catholic Church when the hate group, Westboro Baptist Church held protests against Jews, Catholics, and gays on October 17th and 18th. The Topeka, Kansas WBC has gone to over 600 cities and staged 40,000 protests across the country and in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Canada. This "church" is not part of the mainstream Baptist church. Among the counter protesters giving support to Chabad were All Saints Lutheran Pastor Paul Bieber and his son. All Saints backs up to Chabad property...UCCA will elect new officers for 2010. 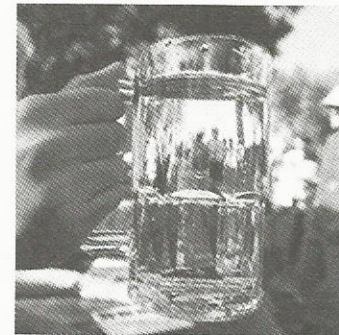

There was a real family feel to the event. We had older UC folks, younger UC folks - a real mix. Even spotted a few college kids in there! We heard from people who had not had contact with EdUCate for a long time that it was good to be at an EdUCate event again (people whose kids were grown and gone).



The food was awesome. We ran out of everything – we will adjust up a bit next year- but no leftovers is always good. The beer and soda were a huge hit and the collectible glasses and mugs were very popular! The ALSI Ensemble (Accordion Lovers Society International), the Standley Marching band and the El Cajon German Band all performed splendidly.

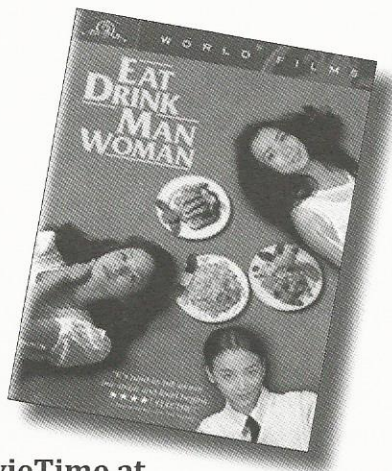

Councilmember Lightner wants you to be aware that the Navy has completed its Final Environmental Impact Statement for the West Coast Basing of the MV-22 "Osprey" aircraft. The document is available for public review at: <http://www.mv22eiswest.net/>

In late November 2009, the U.S. Navy is expected to decide where the MV-22 "Osprey" aircraft will be based on the West Coast. They are considering basing some or all of the aircraft at MCAS Miramar. When making the decision, part of what the Navy takes into consideration are the results of an environmental study called an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and the comments they received from the public. A hard copy of the Final EIS is available at the San Diego Public Library, Mira Mesa Branch, 8405 New Salem Street, 92126.

California Legislature

Last November, I was elected to my first term in the California State Assembly. This gives me the great honor of representing the people of the 75th District—which includes my home, University City. UC is a terrific community. My wife and I bought our first home here. We love our neighbors, Sunday Concerts in the Park, and of course, sneaking out for dinner at Lorna's.

Upon taking office, I pledged to do regular town hall meetings to hear constituents' concerns firsthand. The first was at the Standley Recreation Center. There we discussed the concerns we all share about rising unemployment, education cuts, affordable health care and many other issues. I also heard people's frustrations with the legislature. As someone new to Sacramento, I share much of that frustration.

While many important matters are still pending in Sacramento, I have worked hard to address issues of local importance in a bi-partisan fashion. We built a coalition to support our local biotech community and create jobs, worked to restore funding for an engineering building at UCSD and helped get much-needed flexibility for our local schools. I also worked to pass legislation to improve safety in nursing homes, help our returning veterans and make government run more efficiently. But there's a lot more to do, so it's time for the legislature to reconvene to address our state's water crisis and take action to encourage job growth in California.

But it isn't just state issues I spend time on. When a UC resident contacted me upset about a plan to close our local Post Office, I put my office's full force behind the effort to protect it—and we were successful. Whether it is addressing state issues in Sacramento or local ones here at home, it is an honor to serve as your representative.

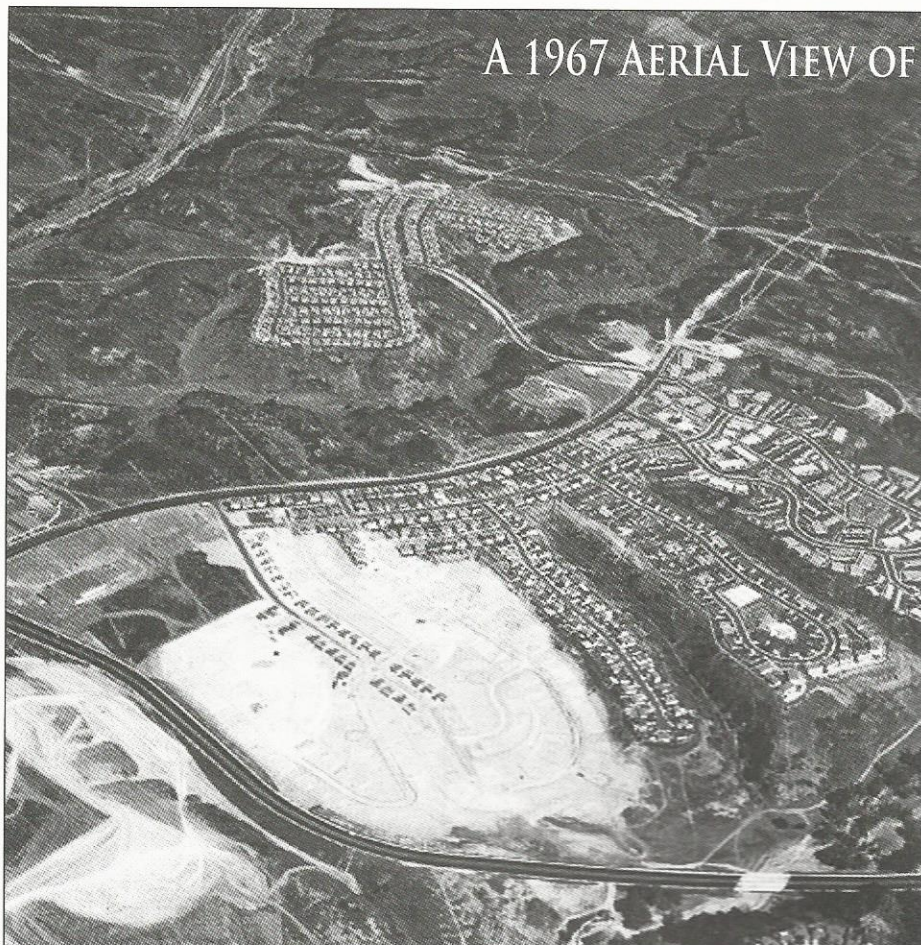

A 1967 AERIAL VIEW OF UNIVERSITY CITY



In 1967 a friend of Bob and Nancy Howe (residents of UC since 1964) flew to San Diego from Alaska in his Cessna single engine aircraft. He took them on a fly around San Diego, while Bob shot photos from the Cessna. Among them was this shot of the eastern portion of University City, where the Howe's current home was still in the development stage. (that is on Raya Way, south of the Von's shopping center.)

The houses shown in the "sandy" area are along Agee Street and the Vons (formerly Safeway) is shown far left at the Genesee/ Governor intersection. In the upper middle left is the housing development known then as "Campus Park." Some of those homes sold for \$14,000 in 1966. Visible also is the pool at Pennant Village, the area where the Howe's lived prior to buying their home. Note that Governor Drive peters out at the east end and that the present I-805 seems to be a dirt path. Likewise Route 52. At the time also there was no development north of Governor (e.g. UTC).

Other photos taken during the flight included, the brand new San Diego Jack Murphy Stadium, Mission Bay and San Diego Harbor.
