The Teen Drivers will spend time with their parent (s) in a classroom environment lead by San Diego Police Officers and then the teens will be released to go to the DUI Checkpoint. At this time the parents have Program Location: the opportunity for their own classroom time until the teens return.

The youth will be taken to an up and running DUI Checkpoint some where in the City of San Diego. The youth will be allowed to observe all elements of the DUI checkpoint from first contact through evaluation to arrest. The youth will then be taken back to the Police Station and after a short debriefing they be released back to their parents.
